# STUDENT RECOGNITION STUDENT OF THE YEAR

DIVYA KAUSHIK, a distinguished final year student of B.Com. (Hons.) is being felicitated as Student of the Year. She is an all-rounder and strives for excellence in every walk of life- be it academic, martial arts, creative writing, and command over mathematical computation.

She holds total ten world records and five national records in the field of Mathematics. The nine World Records included in the Limca Book of Records are for computing- 120 digit table in 21 minutes and 40 seconds, 50 sums of 9 digit cube roots, 30 sums of 12 digit cube roots, 4 sums of 8 digit squares and 2 sums of 15 digit X 15 digit respectively in 5 minutes, 3 sums of 9 digit squares in 4 minutes and 30 seconds, 2 sums of 10 digit squares in 4 minutes, 150 digit table in 25 minutes and 24 seconds, and 28 sums of fifth root of 10 digits. The five National Records in Limca Book of Records are for computing- 20-digit table, 10 sums of 5 digit X 5 digit, 5 sums of 6 digit X 6 digit, and 4 sums of 7 digit X 7 digit in 5 minutes respectively, and 100 digit table in 20 minutes. She has secured the first position in speed and accuracy in Abacus Championship organized by Abacus Champs Academy for three years consecutively.

She has recently acquired the tenth world record i.e. the Guinness World Records Title for 'Longest Consecutive Multiplication in thirty minutes' in March, 2019. She started with a single digit and kept multiplying it by another single digit and was able to do this 50 times in 30 minutes. To break the existing record, she had to do it a minimum of 35 times.

She is a docile yet a very strong-spirited person. She stood second in IK Onkar National Gatka Cup 2017 held in Chandigarh and in the Inter-College Gatka Competition 2018 held at SGGSCC. She is mixed martial artist (intermediate level) at International Tang Soo Do Federation. An avid learner, she can speak and write French at intermediate level and Japanese at the Beginner level. She can do Rubik's cube blindfolded solving (3 X 3) and with sight (up to 7 X 7), mirror cube and twister. She is also creatively inclined with interests in sketching as well as writing and has a blog on poetry, Hello Poetry. She has consistently done brilliantly in her academics culminating into a perfect score of 10 SGPA in her Semester V Exams. This has been the result of her cent percent attendance in the class and discipline towards studies.



# STRIDES TOWARDS REACHING NEW ACADEMIC HEIGHTS

## Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

IQAC, with an objective to pursue quality enhancement and sustenance measures is making constant, consistent and catalytic improvement in the core activities and other related endeavors of the college. It has been working zealously to initiate and implement the broad objectives outlined under the purview of NAAC's four quadrant approaches i.e. Infrastructural Growth, Empowering Students, Faculty and Non-Teaching Staff.

A procedure for software creation for Online Stock Maintenance was initiated. Monthly Salary Slips of the employees were made available online on the SmartProf App. All Provident Fund Records of Faculty Members (since 2000-till date) were digitized and were made available on the college app. A process to create individual Faculty's Profile on the college website was initiated. Creation of Information Centre to collect details of all college events/societies was further improved. To empower students, Punjabi Language Remedial Classes were conducted for first year students.

Drishti Undergraduate Colleges Survey 2018 was submitted. Domain-based E-mail IDs were created for each Society/Club/Department. Creation of Google Classroom for systematized data collection in IQAC Information Centre was further improvised. Digital ID Cards for Students, Faculty and Support Staff were created. Recruitment drives this season, witnessed a gratifying start with the arrival of EY GDS, KPMG Global, Deloitte USI, Wipro, Oberoi Groups, Zycus, Dell, Byjus, Grant Thornton, Tata Power Delhi Distribution Limited among others. A student pool of 550+applied and 182 have been placed in 26 firms till date and the upward trend continues. There has also been a significant rise in the number of students hired by the Big Four firms. KPMG Globals' hiring increased by 104%.

While the average package stands at INR 4.5 LPA, the highest package secured is as high as 7 LPA by Zycus. Internship wing has witnessed a hike in the number of profiles this year from 27 to 35. The number of firms offering these internships, increased by 30%, offered by EY, ShareKhan, Paytm, KenResearch, Times Group and many more. Multiple training sessions covering various verticals like CV Building and Public Speaking accompanied with interview questions on HR and Technical knowledge have been shared this year. 
### **VIRTUOSO The Fine Arts Society**


### **FOLKING DESI The Bhangra Society**


