The workshop was attended by both teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. The resource persons of the Faculty Development Workshop were **Advocate Neeraj Arora** and **Dr. Sunaina Kanojia**. Advocate Neeraj Arora, Advocate-on-Record in Supreme Court and a Technocrat, Professional Speaker in the Cyber Domain, an International Arbitrator, Computer Forensic Expert and an Educator and Law Enforcement Professional has specialization in Legal, Finance and Technological expertise was the resource person for the first session of the workshop; **Role of Cyber Evidence in Personal and Financial Well Being**. His educational qualifications include PG Diploma in ADR, Cyber Law and Drafting of Legislation from ILI. In cyber domain, he has done PGD (Cyber Law), CEH, CHFI, CISA, CISSP & MBA (IT). He is also Certified Forensic Computer Expert (CFCE) from IACIS. An International Coach on Computer Forensic with International Association of Computer Investigative Specialist (IACIS), U.S. The workshop started with an insightful session where Advocate Neeraj Arora explained about the concept of Digital footprints. He made the audience aware of the fact that a hacking software can take the valuable and sensitive information from the gadgets in absence of a valid anti-virus software installed in the gadget. He explained that how financial information and login credentials, in the electronic gadgets, can be kept safe. He explained that installing a web application can result in to sharing personal information with the third party according to the Privacy Policy of the said web application. He enlisted the process explaining how to maintain personal and financial well being by opening a web site in browser. He also explained that the frequent check-ins and sharing personal information over social media applications should be avoided else the consequences can be dreadful. The session was concluded by an interjecting session where the Advocate Neeraj Arora entertained queries from the audience. The first session was followed by a tea break. Post-tea break, second session was conducted by Dr. Sunaina Kanojia, who is currently an Associate Professor, Department of Commerce, University of Delhi and OSD, Institute of Cyber Security and Law, University of Delhi.
